

Portfolio Interview for L2 Extended Certificate in Art and Design

To be a successful art student you need to be creative, open minded, enthusiastic and very hard-working.

Studying on any Art and Design course requires full commitment and a genuine interest and passion for the subject.

Due to the current situation, this year you are required to put together a 10 slide presentation at least 24 hours in advance of your interview that you should upload via the online portal. Guidance for the portfolio are detailed below.

10 Slide Presentation Portfolio Requirements:

This presentation should demonstrate your Skill Set and should include the following:

- Examples of observational drawings in any chosen media. These can be of any subject matter but they must be directly observed.
- Evidence of art and design research or contextual work that relates to your practical work.
- Development work that shows a range of media you have explored.
- Completed pieces of artwork in any media- these could be drawings, paintings, prints, graphic design, textile designs, sculptures, photographs, digital art, installations etc.
- Consider the pieces you choose to include – keep it lively, well presented and consider the layout of each slide (e.g. how many images do you include each slide? What images work well together?)

How to submit your portfolio:

Please upload your 10 Slide Presentation Portfolio to the online portal at least 24 hours in advance of your interview.

How to prepare for interview:

Your interview at One with one of our Art and Design Teachers will help us to ascertain whether you have the potential to achieve well in this course. Please be prepared to talk about your artwork in interview. Consider what skills you have demonstrated, what has inspired your work, have you researched any particular artists and how could you improve your work.
